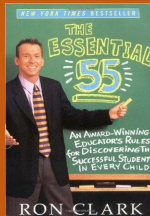
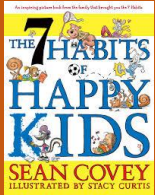

April is Autism Awareness Month. A group of volunteers & professionals from Lifeskills, WKU Renshaw Early Childhood Center (Big Red School), Graves Gilbert Clinic, First Steps, and the Autism & Asperger Support Group of Bowling Green (AASBG) have come together to provide families with free autism screenings for children ages 12 months to 5 years old. **There will be goody bags for all who complete a screener on site. It only takes a few minutes, and our children are worth it!**

- The American Academy of Pediatrics recommends autism specific screenings to be performed on all children at 18 month and 24 month well-child visits.
- 1 in 68 children are diagnosed on the autism spectrum.
- Boys (1 in 42) are 5 times more likely to be diagnosed than girls (1 in 189).
- Evidence shows that **early intervention** improves long term outcomes for children on the autism spectrum.

Warren County Preschool Announcement:

Your three- or four-year-old child may be eligible for Warren County Schools' Preschool Program if your child has a disability or delay. Disabilities and delays range from very mild to very involved. Quite often a child has a simple delay in speech or language development that may not be detected until kindergarten. The earlier a child receives intervention services, the better prepared your child will be for school and academic success. If your child is already three years old or will be turning three soon and you suspect there might be a disability or delay, now is the time to begin the process so that your child might be able to begin school in August! Please call the preschool teacher at the school that your child would attend or call the Preschool Consultant Office at 270-467-0411 for more information. We want every child to be prepared for school success!
