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Dear WCPS Community,

Due to the continued enrollment growth of Warren County Public Schools (now the state's fourth largest district), WCPS personnel have been examining current boundary lines in anticipation of changes scheduled to go into effect for the 2021-2022 school year. You are receiving this communication because your family may be impacted.

It is important to note that there will be NO CHANGES to our middle or high school boundary lines. The schools most likely to be impacted by these potential changes are Alvaton, Briarwood, Cumberland Trace, Jody Richards, Lost River, Natcher and Warren Elementary schools. School Board members will consider the following information before making any changes to the current boundary lines:

1. To provide a high-quality learning environment and equitable opportunities for students in all schools
2. To maintain a neighborhood school community
3. To improve the balance of both economic and racial diversity in our schools.
4. To accommodate current & future student growth
5. To establish a more efficient bus transportation system in order to minimize student transportation time and cost.

As with any decision that directly impacts our students, we welcome your feedback and have created an online resource with additional information including a communication tool to share your thoughts. Additionally, anyone wishing to address the Board is encouraged to attend our regularly scheduled meeting on January 21, 2021 at 6:30 pm in the Warren Central High School auditorium. Central Office personnel will be on hand to record feedback/suggestions for consideration by the Warren County Board of Education members. The Board of Education is scheduled to vote on a new redistricting plan at the February 11, 2021 Board Meeting.
